1.7 Whitewater rafting

Each of these images comes from an International Maritime Signal Flag (see http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/International_maritime_signal_flags) that has had some transformation applied to it (e.g. cropping, rotating, gluing to another flag, etc.). Applying the same transformation to the corresponding letter or letters yields a figure that looks like a new letter.

The transformations applied to the flags and the resulting letters are:

- ullet D that has been cropped to keep only the left-hand strip o I
- Z that has been rotated 90° counterclockwise \rightarrow N
- ullet B that has been cropped to keep only the upper half \to **D**
- ullet L that has been cropped to keep only the left-hand strip $ightarrow {f I}$
- The top half of an O atop another top half of an $O \to A$
- Z that has been rotated 90° clockwise \rightarrow **N**
- F glued to I (in that order), then horizontally shrunk to fit $\to \mathbf{A}$
- ullet U whose left-hand strip has been removed \to **J**
- U under an upside-down U, then shrunk vertically \rightarrow **O**
- ullet W whose left-hand strip has been cropped out o N
- B whose right-hand strip has been cropped out $\rightarrow \mathbf{E}$
- Left half of an O on top of the right half of an O, shrunk vertically $\rightarrow \mathbf{S}$

Reading these letters (left to right and top to bottom) gives the answer: INDIANA JONES.
