## 2 Round 2

### 2.1 Do you have the time?

On the top half of the page there are 11 lines of gibberish; on the bottom half of the page are 10 times of the day. The lines of gibberish are times written in a made-up language whose syntax and vocabulary you must deduce; 10 of these times match the 10 given times, and the 11th is the answer to the puzzle. Here is a dictionary:

- perata $\rightarrow$ o'clock
- mau i ti $\rightarrow$ after
- ke ti $\rightarrow$ before
- me $\rightarrow$ plus
- ani $\rightarrow 9$
- kero $\rightarrow 0$
- lomo $\rightarrow 4$
- omo $\rightarrow 6$
- nura $\rightarrow 8$
- rotu $\rightarrow 3$
- salabe $\rightarrow 1$
- tepai $\rightarrow 10$
- tinhu $\rightarrow 7$
- tum $\rightarrow 2$
- tum tepai $\rightarrow 20$.

So the extra time is the eighth one, "tepai me omo mau i ti omo perata," which translates as "ten plus six after six o'clock." Thus the answer is 6:16 (or 616).
